Psalm: Psalm 86:11-17

- L ¹¹Teach me your way, O LORD, and I will walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart to revere your name.
- C 12I will thank you, O Lord my God, with all my heart, and glorify your name forevermore.
- L ¹³For great is your love toward me; you have delivered me from the pit of death.
- C ¹⁴The arrogant rise up against me, O God, and a band of violent people seeks my life; they have not set you before their eyes.
- L ¹⁵But you, O Lord, are gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger, and full of kindness and truth.
- C ¹⁶Turn to me and have mercy on me; give your strength to your servant, and save the child of your handmaid.
- L ¹⁷Show me a sign of your favor, so that those who hate me may see it and be put to shame; because you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me.

Lesson: Romans 8:12-25

For Paul, true spirituality means that we experience the reality of the Spirit, which enables us to pray as God's children, keeps us in solidarity with creation, and gives us unseen hope that God will liberate us and creation from bondage to death and decay.

Apostle's Creed
