P: You are the treasured people of the LORD,

C: a people holy to the LORD our God.

P: Keep the words of the LORD in your heart; teach them to your children.

C: Talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise.

P: One does not live by bread alone,

C: but by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. Deut. 26, 11, 8

## **Prayer of the Day**

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray,

C: O God, you direct our lives by your grace, and your words of justice and mercy reshape the world. Mold us into a people who welcome your word and serve one another, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Lesson: Jeremiah 28:5-9

Through a symbolic action, Jeremiah insisted that Judah and all the surrounding nations should submit to the king of Babylon. Hananiah contradicted Jeremiah, who in reply insisted that Hananiah's rosy prediction should not be believed until it came true. God confirmed the word of Jeremiah and sentenced

the false prophet Hananiah to death (vv. 16-17).

## Psalm 89:1-4, 15-18

- L: <sup>1</sup>Your love, O LORD, forever will I sing; from age to age my mouth will proclaim your faithfulness.
- C: <sup>2</sup>For I am persuaded that your steadfast love is established forever; you have set your faithfulness firmly in the heavens.
- L: <sup>3</sup>"I have made a covenant with my chosen one; I have sworn an oath to David my servant:
- C: 4'I will establish your line forever, and preserve your throne for all generations.'"
- L: <sup>15</sup>Happy are the people who know the festal shout! They walk, O LORD, in the light of your presence.
- C: <sup>16</sup>They rejoice daily in your name; they are jubilant in your righteousness.
- L: <sup>17</sup>For you are the glory of their strength, and by your favor our might is exalted.
- C: <sup>18</sup>Truly, our shield belongs to the LORD; our king to the Holy One of Israel.

Lesson: Romans 6:12-23

Sin is an enslaving power that motivates us to live self-serving, disobedient lives. Sin's final payoff is death. We, however, have been set free from sin's slavery to live obediently under God's grace, whose end is the free gift of eternal life.

P: Gracious God,

C: have mercy on us. In your compassion forgive us our sins, known and unknown, things done and left undone. Uphold us by your Spirit so that we may live and serve you in newness of life, to the honor and glory of your holy name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

P: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

C: Amen.
